Definitions

“Number of Students Who Began Program” is the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

“Students available for graduation” is the number of students who began program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

“Number of On-Time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.

“On-Time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

“150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates). “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.

“Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

“Graduates unavailable for employment” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

“Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completed the application educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six-month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.



Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

Number of Students Taking Exam is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

“First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after the student completed a program.

Passage Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

“Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

“Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.

“No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

“STUDENT’S RIGHT TO CANCEL”

CANCELLATION, WITHDRAWAL, AND REFUND

The student has the right to cancel and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. If you choose to cancel this agreement, AHE will refund any money that you paid less specified non-refundable fees. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation addressed to Program Director and sent by US certified mail, facsimile, or hand delivered. The written notice of cancellation is effective on the date received by AHE. The refund will be issued within 45 days of the notice of cancellation.

AHE follows refund guidelines set by the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education in accordance with 5 CCR 71750. You have the right to withdraw from a course of instruction at any time. If you withdraw from a course of instruction after the period allowed for cancellation of the agreement set forth above, AHE will issue a pro-rata refund for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance. The pro-rata refund will be calculated as follows: total institutional charge divided by the number of days in the program, multiplied by the number of days student attended, or was scheduled to attend prior to withdrawal, less the amount paid by the student. All amounts paid in excess of what is owed as calculated above shall be refunded within 45 days of the student’s withdrawal or cancellation.

If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
